Ronny was always one of the first at the party and always the first at work - he just did it all. He was a great guy and a great dog handler and friend. We will always miss you Ronny.

Ron and I worked together not only as USAF Security Police K-9 Sentry Dog Handlers at U-Tapao, but also during our time as the two K-9 Marijuana Dog Handler Teams on base and off. I say off base because of one detail we were assigned to one evening. We were called in to SP HQ one afternoon and were advised we would both be going off base with a detail of SP's to investigate a bungalow where GI's were reported to be staying and smoking dope. As it turn out the stuff was everywhere in the place and in plain sight. The dog's olfactory senses were soon overloaded. We kind of looked at each other and knew there was not much need for the dogs at this point. It was interesting to observe their behavior looking for something and finding it everyplace they went. We had a good laugh and headed back to the base leaving the rest of the detail to do their thing.

Ron was a good natured person and liked to have fun but was a serious dog handler too. Ron came up with the idea for that great shoulder patch for King and I just recently found one I made for Shannon that I had forgotten about. I am grateful to have it and I thank Ron for the idea and my mother for keeping it for me all these years. I recall Ron took on one drug search assignment at the SP barracks with King that I did not particularly want to be part of. Ron carried on with the duty. It was not an easy task for him either as we discussed later on. But that is what you liked about Ron. He was willing to handle what came his way. You could depend on him to complete his work and watch your back.

Thought about you often Ron, over the years, and will continue to do so.
