
(2016-2017) More 6th Grade Letters to War Dog Handlers

Thank you for giving the time, consideration, and thought to read my letter.



Dear Vietnam Veterans,

I wanted to start by thanking all of you and your dogs for your service. We read the book Cracker in Mrs. Debolt's class, and towards the end I realized the reality of the Vietnam war. I am deeply sorry for the way you and your dogs were treated, after saving so many lives. I would like to know, if you remember, what your first mission was like, and what your dog's personality was. One things I learned about was the M.R.E. food rations. What was your favorite M.R.E. and did any of them have desserts or sweets in them? We also learned about dog handlers and their dogs walking point. Was that always nerve racking or after a lot of missions did you start to worry a little less? I remember that in Cracker all the guys got Thanksgiving dinner. Did you get to have that to? If so, was it better than the M.R.E.'s? I don't know if I ever would have been able to do what you did. We learned that about 4,000 dogs went to Vietnam and only about 200 came back. I know that if I had to leave my German Shepard Lab in a foreign country that I would be terribly upset. My uncle was also in the Vietnam War. He was in the Marines Bravo Company 1/26, and worked with a dog handler and male german shepherd. Looking for suspected caves on Hill 881 North. Which was controlled by the NVA. My uncle said," It was hilly, hot, 10 clicks away and the dog and his handler walked point through 6ft elephant grass with our platoons behind him and on his flanks. About 6hrs into the search the dog got overheated and his handler bad to carry him on his shoulders. Other Marines offered to help but the dog wasn't having any of it. It was probably close to 100 degrees, very mountainous, and the poor dog had a fur coat on." So thank you again for your service, and happy veterans day!




